

On April 26, 2024, Wilkes University will present the sixth annual Pennsylvania Pain and Addiction Summit. This one-day conference will be held in-person on the campus of Wilkes University in Wilkes-Barre, PA. The event brings together medical, legal, and law enforcement professionals to discuss the current state of the opioid crisis and share methodology and interprofessional approaches.

The theme of the 2024 Pennsylvania Pain and Addiction Summit is "Access to Care."

### **Needs Assessment:**

- The national opioid crisis continues to impact several lives. While preliminary reports show a mild decrease in overall death rates in 2018, continued efforts must be made to educate both professionals and the public to the nature of opioid use disorder, and appropriate pain management.
- Department of Health and Human Services Secretary Azar recently stated that more work is yet to be done, and focus must also be given to the rising threat of cocaine and methamphetamine related deaths. Furthermore, despite national efforts to increase access to the lifesaving medication naloxone, data from the CDC shows that only one of every sixty nine prescriptions for opioids had a concurrent naloxone dispensed with it. The CDC goes on to say that addressing both pain management and substance use disorder in an Interprofessional manner can result in improved patient outcomes. Clearly, ongoing educational efforts targeted to all professionals associated with the care of patients with chronic pain and/or substance use disorder must remain a primary target of continuing professional training.

### **Program objectives:**

- 1. Describe the role of various members of the health care team in the treatment of pain and substance use disorder.
- 2. Discuss the importance of an inter-professional approach to the treatment of pain and substance use disorder.

- 3. Discuss methods that can be used in individual practice settings to help a patient with pain or substance use disorder
- 4. Identify opportunities to utilize an inter-professional approach to the treatment of pain and substance use disorder

The Court reminds all attorneys who are representing individuals in Protection From Abuse matters that if an individual is prohibited by the Court from possessing or acquiring firearms and/or other weapons for the duration of a temporary or final protection order, that individual **shall** relinguish his or her firearms and/or other weapons, licenses, and any ammunition to the sheriff or the appropriate law enforcement agency. In lieu of relinquishment to the sheriff or the appropriate law enforcement agency, that individual may relinquish within the required time frame to a dealer licensed pursuant to 18 **Pa. C.S. § 6113** or third party authorized by the sheriff's department. Please refer to 23 Pa. C.S. § 6108 for further information.

- 3. In the event the Pre-Trial Conference is waived, the parties must file the Pre-Trial Statement no later than ten (10) days prior to the trial date. The parties may NOT WAIVE the filing of the pretrial statements by consent. Failure of both parties to file pretrials may result in a continuance of the trial, sanctions and/ or counsel fees. IN THE EVENT ONE PARTY FAILS TO FILE A PRE-TRIAL STATEMENT, THAT PARTY SHALL NOT BE PERMIT-TED TO PRESENT ANY EVI-DENCE, EXCEPT HIS OR HER OWN TESTIMONY. IF PRE-TRIAL STATEMENTS ARE NOT TIMELY FILED, THE COURT MAY CAN-CEL THE TRIAL AND PLACE ANOTHER CASE IN THE TRIAL

DATES. NO NEW TRIAL DATE WILL BE RESCHEDULED UNTIL PRE-TRIAL STATEMENTS ARE PROPERLY FILED. The filing of the pre-trial statements are mandatory and appropriate sanctions will be entered in the event statements are entered in the event that statements are not timely filed. The pre-trial statements shall include the following matters:

- a. Statement of any Stipulated Facts;
- b. A narrative statement of the facts;
- c. Any unusual issues expected to be raised at the Custody Trial;
- d. The findings of fact in support of each of the sixteen (16) factors for custody;
- e. The current custody schedule;
- f. Proposed Alternative Final Orders of Court;
- g. The name of each person whom the party intends to call at trial as witnesses: and
- h. List of all exhibits that party expects to offer into evidence.
- 4. In the event the Pre-Trial Conference is not waived, the parties MUST file and serve pretrial statements in support of their respective positions no later than ten (10) days prior to the Pre-Trial Conference, INCLUDING SELF-REPRESENTED LITIGANTS IN ORDER TO ADMIT ANY EVIDENCE.

#### CUSTODY TRIAL:

5. Prior to the commencement of the Custody Trial, counsel is directed to pre-marks exhibits,

review them with opposing counsel, and have sufficient copies for the Court. An expert report must be provided to opposing counsel prior to the Trial as required by the Pennsylvania Rules of Civil Procedure.

6. If a party believes that the child/children's testimony may be necessary, counsel should notify the Court by email to m.stone@luzernecounty.org at leave five (5) days prior to the time of trial so that appropriate arrangements may be made. Counsel should be aware that in the event the Court determines that the testimony is necessary, the Court prefers to schedule the child/children's testimony after at least some initial testimony from the expert or the parties. Further, the Court will endeavour to schedule the testimony so that the child/children do not miss school or so that there is a minimum amount of waiting time for the child/children.

7. No party may make a change in residence of the child

which significantly impairs the ability of the other party to exercise custodial rights without first complying with all the applicable provisions of 23 Pa.C.S.§5337 and Pa.R.C.P. 1915.17 regarding relocation.

8. The Criminal Record/Abuse History Verifications filed of record by the parties addressing the factors in Pa.C.S.§5329 (a) or (b) have been considered by the Court and is part of the Court's determination that there is no threat of harm to the children given the above Order.

COMPLIANCE IS HEREBY DIRECTED.

ALL PRIOR ORDERS NOT INCONSISTENT WITH THIS ORDER SHALL REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.

The offices of Judicial Records and Services of Luzerne County, Pennsylvania shall give notice of this Order to all parties pursuant to Pa. R.C.P. 236.
